St. Francis Solanus Feast Day:

In the United States, July 16th is the feast day of St. Francis Solanus, the patron saint of one of Mary, Mother of Mercy Parish Churches in Interlaken, NY. St. Francis Solanus was born March 10, 1549 in Montilla, Spain and died on July 14, 1610 in Lima, Peru, South America. He was a very successful Franciscan missionary and is called the "Apostle of the Tucuman", that is today northwestern Argentina and Paraguay.

Divine Mercy Chaplet at St. James the Apostle:

On First Fridays beginning August 1st, there will be a recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00 p.m. at St. James the Apostle, Trumansburg.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is a Catholic devotion that implores the Father's mercy by invoking the merits Jesus has won for us through his redemptive Sacrifice of Calvary. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is typically prayed using Catholic rosary beads. The prayers in the Divine Mercy Chaplet come from the *Diary of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska*, a Polish nun who received private revelations from Jesus in the 1930s.

Catholic Ministries Appeal – Parish Distribution:

In February 2025, President Trump issued an executive order calling for policies to make in vitro fertilization less costly and more available. Our Bishops are urging ethical alternatives because IVF destroys human life. "As pastors, we see the suffering of so many couples experiencing infertility and know their deep desire to have children is both good and admirable; yet the Administration's push for IVF, which ends countless human lives and treats persons like property, cannot be the answer... The IVF industry treats human beings like products and freezes or kills millions of children who are not selected for transfer to a womb or do not survive. The executive order promoting IVF is thus fatally flawed and stands in regrettable contrast to the promising pro-life actions of the Administration..., Every human person is a precious gift with infinite dignity and worth, no matter how that person was conceived. People born as a result of IVF have no lies dignity than anyone else. It is our moral responsibility to uphold the dignity of their brothers and sisters who are never given the chance to be born.
