



In February 2025, President Trump issued an executive order calling for policies to make in vitro fertilization less costly and more available. Our Bishops are urging ethical alternatives because IVF destroys human life. "As pastors, we see the suffering of so many couples experiencing infertility and know their deep desire to have children is both good and admirable; yet the Administration's push for IVF, which ends countless human lives and treats persons like property, cannot be the answer... The IVF industry treats human beings like products and freezes or kills millions of children who are not selected for transfer to a womb or do not survive. The executive order promoting IVF is thus fatally flawed and stands in regrettable contrast to the promising pro-life actions of the Administration..., Every human person is a precious gift with infinite dignity and worth, no matter how that person was conceived. People born as a result of IVF have no lies dignity than anyone else. It is our moral responsibility to uphold the dignity of their brothers and sisters who are never given the chance to be born.
