

# Children's Liturgy of the Word:

The Roman Catholic Church has provided an option for children when they attend Mass. After the opening prayer, children are dismissed with their adult leaders to the Annex to hear and reflect on the readings in age-appropriate formats. As time permits, children engage in activities reinforcing the message of the readings such as singing songs, coloring, or acting out a skit. Children will return to their families during the offertory procession.

All children are invited to participate in the Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Saturdays July 20 and August 17 at St. Francis Solanus Church.

#### Parish Census—Volunteers Needed:

The Diocesan offices of Stewardship and Information Technology have notified our parish that our parish census will take place in the months of June/July/August. The census objective is to gather accurate and up-to-date contact and household information for all registered and unregistered

#### **2023-2024 Catholic Ministries Appeal:**

Our parish received a check dated June 21, 2024, for \$632 from the Appeal. The amount reflects 50% of pledges more than our parish goal. The summary, the parish goal was \$31,000; as of June 7, 2024, our parishioners contributed \$32,264; we were \$1,264 over goal, 50% of over goal was returned to the parish. "Thank you" to all the parish households that made this happen. In a letter to the parish dated June 3, 2024, Bishop Salvatore Matano express his sincere gratitude for exceeding the parish assigned goal in supporting the mission of the Diocese. Bishop Matano prays that Our Lord will continue to bless our parish family.

# **Catholic Action Network – Update:**

The New York State Legislature concluded this year's legislative session on June 8. Here is a summary of the "Prohibited Hospital Interference with Patient Care S6616-A (May) A5297-A (Paulin)" This bill would purportedly prohibit hospital interference with patient care where the practitioner is acting in good faith and within their scope of practice. However, it is a clear violation of the rights of Catholic hospitals and another attempt to harass them. The bill is incredibly broad and could serve to mandate that all hospitals permit abortion on demand for any reason. We worked closely with Catholic Health Long Island, as well as the Greater New York Hospital Association, in successfully opposing this bill. Our first amendment concerns were heard and acknowledged by the Senate Health Committee Chair, and the bill died in that committee. Though it seemed to be moving in the Assembly our opposition was heard and it stalled on the Assembly floor.
