Catholic Action Network – Update:

The New York State Legislature concluded this year's legislative session on Saturday, June 8. Here is a summary of the Nonpublic Dignity for All Students Act: The closing weeks of the legislative session saw an increased effort to extend core provisions of the Dignity for All Students Act (DASA), enacted in 2010, to religious and independent schools. The core provisions would prohibit "discrimination" for a variety of reasons, including for "a person's gender identity or expression." This could mean that requiring students to wear uniforms, use restrooms, and play on sports teams that correspond to their biological sex could be deemed "discrimination: under state law." In addition to direct and intensive advocacy by Catholic Conference staff, together with coalition partners, our Catholic Action Network alert generated over 14,000 emails to lawmaker urging them to reject the bill. We're happy to report that the measure was held without further consideration.


