

Daily Mass:

The Season of Lent is a penitential season, that is, a personal transformational season. The traditional Lenten practice that helps one's transformation is participating in daily Mass or attending Mass on a day or days one is able.

At Mass, one encounters Sacred Scripture, God speaking to us offering a superior way of thinking and acting leading to a greater awareness of how to be like Jesus, a child of God in this world. Participating in Mass, one also encounters Jesus and his love through the reception of his sacrificed body and blood under the appearances of bread and wine. In that union with Jesus there is the opportunity to speak heart to heart with Jesus and pray for family members, fellow parishioners, the sick, etc.

To come to daily Mass, when able, is a sacrifice, a Lenten sacrifice, a sacrifice helping one to repent, that is, to be transformed.

Coffee and Toast at St. Francis Solanus:

On Wednesdays following the 8:30 a.m. daily Mass at St. Francis Solanus, take time to connect with your fellow parishioners over a light breakfast in the Annex.



Stations of the Cross:

- Holy Cross: Wednesdays, 6:00 p.m., followed by a soup supper
- St. James the Apostle: Fridays, 3:00 p.m.

If you would like to volunteer to bring soup for the soup supper, there will be a sign up sheet in the back of Holy Cross church.

Fridays of Lent:

Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence, that is, meatless days. This discipline applies to all Catholics over the age of 14.

Lenten Reminders:

° The season of Lent runs from Ash Wednesday (March 5) until the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (April 17).

- "Alleluia" is not sung or said from the beginning of Lent until the Easter Vigil.
- ° During Lent the altar is not to be decorated with flowers.
- ° Musical instruments may be played only to give necessary support to the singing.
- ^o The readings for the Lenten Masses have been chosen in relation to the themes of baptismal renewal and conversion.
- [°] The Easter celebration is: Holy Thursday, Good Friday & Holy Saturday - *the Easter Triduum* (Three Days of Easter).
- ^o During the Season of Lent, the Church urges all the faithful to reflect a spirit of prayer, penance (conversion), and charity.

Day of Penance:

The Diocese of Rochester has set Wednesday, April 2, 2025, for the priests in all parishes to be available throughout the day for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation - Confession. This day is being offered for the convenience of all the faithful. Please plan to schedule to go to any parish and take advantage of the times offered by the parish for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
