# **Parish Council Nominations:**

Parishioners interested in being on the Parish Council can now nominate themselves or be nominated by other parishioners. The selection of new Parish Council members for a three -year term and the selection of three alternates for a one-year term will take place on Sunday, May 25<sup>th</sup>. Newly selected members will attend the June 12<sup>th</sup> Parish Council meeting. The term of membership begins July 1.

There are no scheduled meetings in the summer. The Parish Council is a council to the pastor. It is not a governing body nor board. Parish Council members are assigned to one of the standing committees (Word, Worship, Witness and Fellowship). The Committees meet sometime before the scheduled meetings. The council usually meets every other month at the Parish Center, Interlaken. Parishioners, please consider being a Council member or nominating a parishioner. Thank you.

#### **Birthright of Ithaca Donations:**

Birthright of Ithaca will not be holding their annual Mother's Day flower sale this year due to the rising costs. Instead of their traditional fundraiser, they ask for donations in honor of their founder, Mary Camobreco, who passed away in February.

"Mary was devoted to the mission of Birthright. Birthright of Ithaca has existed for 43 years due to Mary's dedication and devotion to saving unborn babies. She worked as director for 36 years and remained on our board until her passing. Mary remembered each and every client she helped during those years and had some remarkable stories to share of her experiences as director. To her, the women we help were not clients, they were human beings who needed a helping hand. Women, that no matter their circumstances, were greeted and treated with the love, respect, and dignity that we all deserve."

# **Easter Duty:**

Church law number 920 states: a) All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year, b) This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at some other time during the year. Please note, however, that the United States has been granted an indult of extending the time for the annual reception of Holy Communion from the beginning of Lent through the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity (this year March 5 - June 15). An "indult" is a license granted by competent Church authority for an exception from a particular norm of Church law.

# **Sanctuary Lamp:**

In the sanctuary, a candle called the "sanctuary lamp" is always lit to indicate that the Blessed Sacrament is present in the church. Every week the candle or oil is renewed. Parishioners are welcome to request that the sanctuary lamp is lit for the week for their intention. In an envelope specifying "sanctuary lamp," place a free will offering with your request and preferred week and church. This may be placed in the offering basket or mailed to the parish office.

# **Catholic Ministries Appeal 2024-2025**

Our parish has surpassed its given goal of \$31,000. Ninety parish households have pledged \$35,198 or 113.54% of goal.
