

World Mission Sunday—Next Weekend:

World Mission Sunday, promoted by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith – was established by Pope Pius XI in 1926 as the day of prayer and giving for missions. From its inception, this day has been rooted in the work of its foundress, Blessed Pauline Jaricot, who established prayer circles and collections through which she sent thousands to the Church in the United Sates throughout the 19th century. The World Mission Sunday collection supports 1,124 mission territories – places where the Church is young, growing, poor, persecuted and in need of support. This collection funds the formation of seminarians, catechists, and religious sisters, builds churches and schools, and sustains healthcare and social outreach programs. Next weekend we will celebrate World Mission Sunday. Pope Leo XIV invites the entire Church to support mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and parts of Europe. Please be generous in next week's collection for the Society of the Propagation of the Faith.
