



Respect Life Month:

Every October, The Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month. As Catholics, we are called to welcome, care for, and protect God's gift of human life, with special concern for those who are most vulnerable.

World Mission Sunday—This Weekend:

World Mission Sunday, promoted by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith – was established by Pope Pius XI in 1926 as the day of prayer and giving for missions. From its inception, this day has been rooted in the work of its foundress, Blessed Pauline Jaricot, who established prayer circles and collections through which she sent thousands to the Church in the United Sates throughout the 19th century. The World Mission Sunday collection supports 1,124 mission territories – places where the Church is young, growing, poor, persecuted and in need of support. This collection funds the formation of seminarians, catechists, and religious sisters, builds churches and schools, and sustains healthcare and social outreach programs.

This weekend we celebrate World Mission Sunday. Pope Leo XIV invites the entire Church to support mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and parts of Europe. This year's theme, "Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples." Please be generous in this week's collection for the Society of the Propagation of the Faith.

November 1 – The Solemnity of All Saints:

This Solemnity falls on a Saturday and in accord with church practice in the United States it is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year.

November 2 – Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed:

Also called "All Souls Day" falls on a Sunday this year. It will take precedence over the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time and therefore the Saturday Vigil Mass at 4:00 p.m. (November 1) and the 9:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Sunday Masses (November 2) will liturgically celebrate All Souls Day.-
