



Respect Life Month:

Every October, The Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month. As Catholics, we are called to welcome, care for, and protect God's gift of human life, with special concern for those who are most vulnerable. Cemetery Clean-up:

Please have summer decorations and American flags removed from the parish cemeteries by November 15.

November 1 – The Solemnity of All Saints:

This Solemnity falls on a Saturday and in accord with church practice in the United States it is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year.

November 2 – Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed:

Also called "All Souls Day" falls on a Sunday this year. It will take precedence over the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time and therefore the Saturday Vigil Mass at 4:00 p.m. (November 1) and the 9:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Sunday Masses (November 2) will liturgically celebrate All Souls Day.

It is the custom that the names of one's beloved deceased be submitted to be remembered and prayed for on that day and throughout the month of No-

vember. Envelopes are available in the churches to record the names of those to be remembered and prayed for. The envelopes will remain on the altar for the month of November.

Cemetery Collection Next Weekend:

Next weekend is the second collection to benefit the Mary, Mother of Mercy parish cemeteries. Donations may also be made online using WeShare Online Giving.

Please note that the monetary donation to the cemetery can be specified either for St. James the Apostle or the Holy Cross cemetery. When the monetary donation is not specified, your donation is divided between the two cemeteries. Thank you for your help.

Sweet Sunday:

Next Sunday, and the first Sunday of every month, there is a social time following both the 9:00 a.m. Mass at St. James the Apostle and the 10:30 a.m. Mass at Holy Cross. All are welcome.

2025-2026 Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA)

The active phase of our parish CMA continues. By now you should have received a special letter in the mail with a personalized pledge card. If you have not received a mailing, pledge envelopes are available in the foyer of the Church. Thank you to everyone who has responded with a gift or pledge. If you have not yet responded, please prayerfully consider a gift. The CMA provides funding for important programs, services and ministries that strengthen our whole Church. Every gift to the CMA helps those in need, supports the mission of the Church, and comes back to help our parish. It was reported on October 18th that thirty-three parish households have pledged \$9,395 which represents 29.36% of the \$32,000 parish goal. Thank you. Let us continue to pray for the success of our efforts. (This year there is a Diocesan effort to increase the number of donors over CMA 24-25. The parish with the greatest percentage increase in number of donors will be awarded \$5,000. For every parish that increased the number of donors by 10%+ over CMA24-25 will be awarded \$1,000.)

CROP Hunger Walk:

Trumansburg Area Churches (TAC) sponsored the annual Tom Lange Memorial CROP Hunger Walk on September 28th and reported that as of October 14th, \$10,667 was raised for Church World Service, CROP Hunger Walk. Twenty-five percent of this amount will go to the TAC Food Pantry. (CROP is an acronym for Christian Rural Overseas Program. The Program focuses on: Community Responses to Overcome Poverty and Hunger.) In a report of October 9th, parishioners from The Parish of Mary, Mother of Mercy contributed \$1,179. Thank you to all who participated in the Hunger Walk event.
