

Eucharistic Revival"Invite one back Initiative" Prayer:

God our Father,

You never cease to seek out your children—the lonely, the frightened, the hurt, and the lost. We pray for all our parishioners who have been missing from our parish community and Eucharistic celebrations since COVID.

Through the intercession of Mary, please pave the way for conversations and invitations that welcome them back to the Catholic Church and our parish Community. We trust in your love and mercy for every one of your children. Amen.

Eucharistic Revival – Invite One Back initiative:

Many Catholics have stopped participating in the Church since COVID. This year has been designated by the National Eucharistic Revival as a year of mission – that is in a hospitable way invite a parishioner back to especially encounter Jesus in Holy Communion.

Over the next several weeks we invite parishioners to record the name of a Catholic(s) (parishioner or not) who has stopped coming the Sunday Mass. The names will not be published, however, over the next few months they will be prayed for during the Sunday Masses and at the beginning parish events. During the Season of Advent, in some way, shape, or form, personal contact / invitations will be given to members of our parish family for whom we have been praying will return to the parish family and the Eucharist.

Confirmation Preparation & Adult Study:

Students in eighth grade and above who have not celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation and adults desiring to celebrate Baptism, or Confirmation / First Holy Communion, and everyone desiring to know more about our faith are invited to attend classes on Saturdays (with one exception: the second Saturday of the month) at 5:00–6:15 p.m. in the St. Francis Solanus Annex. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick within Mass:

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, is celebrated only when a Catholic's health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age. On Wednesday, September 25 at 11:00 a.m. at St. Francis Solanus, there will be an anointing within Mass for any Catholic whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age. Catholics who are diagnosed with the beginning of a serious illness may also be anointed for healing. Through the Sacrament of Anointing the Church supports the sick in their struggle against illness and continues Christ's messianic work of healing. A light lunch will be served in the annex following the liturgy. All are welcome to attend.
